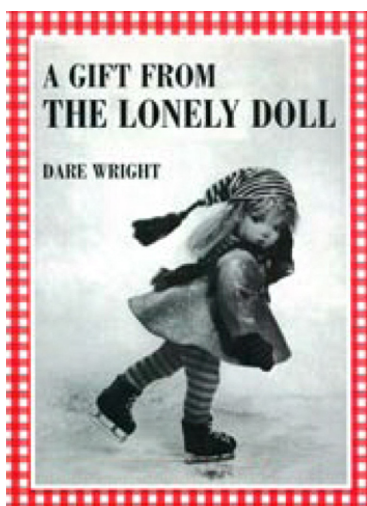
EDITH & MR. BEAR

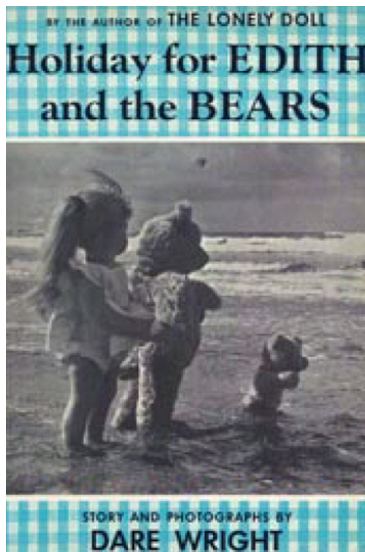

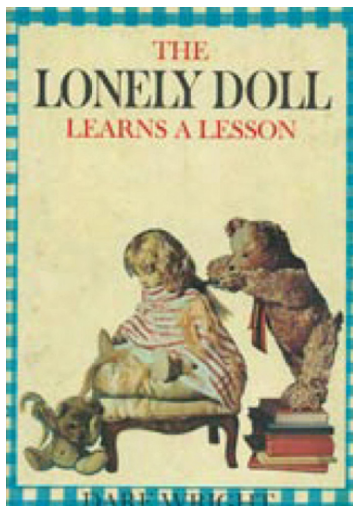
THE DOLL AND THE KITTEN

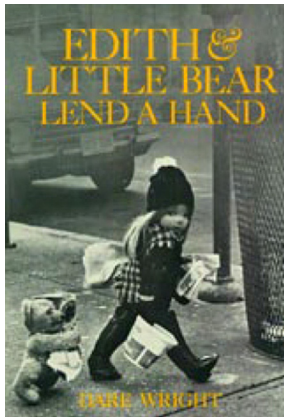
THE LONELY DOLL LEARNS A LESSON

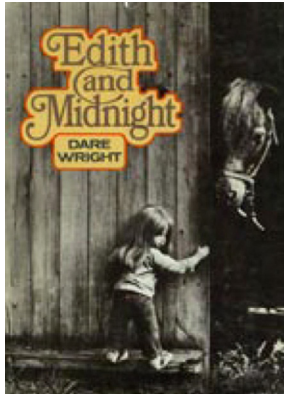
EDITH & LITTLE BEAR LEND A HAND

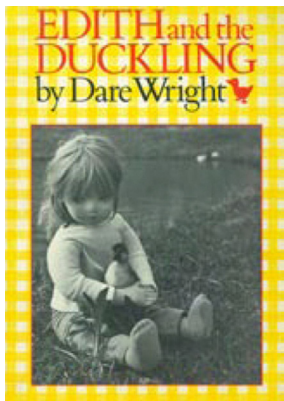
EDITH AND MIDNIGHT

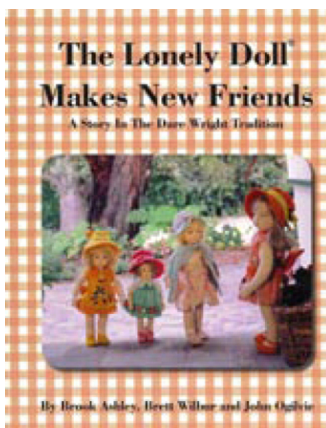
EDITH AND THE DUCKLING

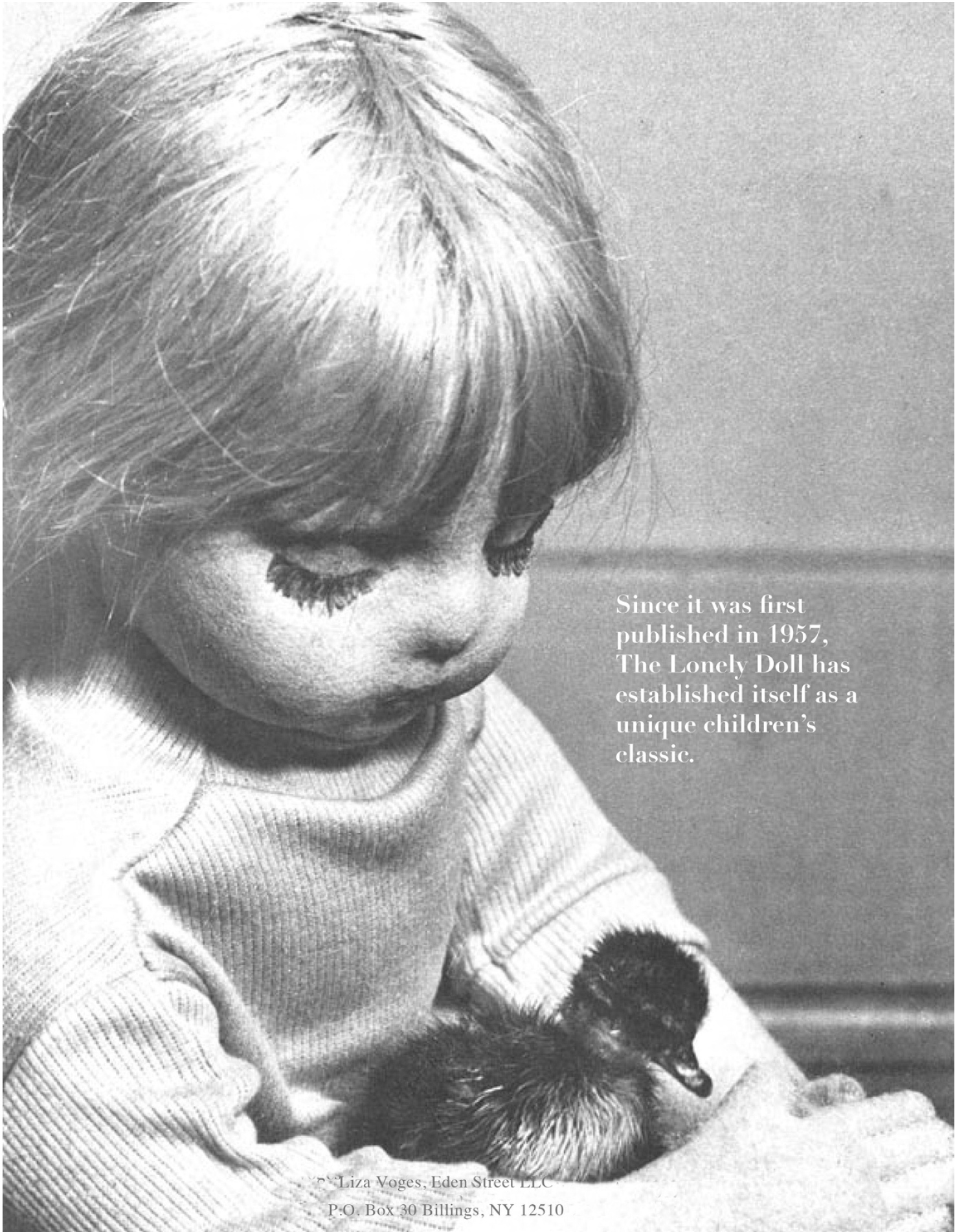
